

Key Outcomes

Increased Civic Pride & Action

Local issues addressed creatively through performances and workshops, with participants proposing community-led solutions.

Greater Green Space Engagement

Vauxhall Pleasure Gardens became a safer, more inclusive space, attracting more diverse use by residents without gardens.

Industry Impact

Diversified the talent pipeline with trained, work-ready young people – 18 participants secured ongoing freelance roles with partner organisations.

Cultural Recognition & Social Inclusion

Celebrated diverse heritage while reintegrating ex-offenders, strengthening ties with local police, and building social capital.





Catalyst Effect of EIF Funding

Legacy Infrastructure & Partnerships

- Secured a 20-year rent-free cultural incubator (House of NEON) valued at £3.9 million
- Partnership with Vauxhall City Farm & artist Vicky Long to build a permanent Treehouse Stage for 2026
- Youth co-created EDI policy will form a chapter in The Purple Guide

COLOURS & CULTURES is now established as an official annual event, embedded in NEON's long-term programme and backed by multi-year funding from the Mayor of London (confirmed July 2025).

Challenges & Triumphs

Challenges Overcome

Compressed Timelines

Funding confirmation delays condensed planning period, requiring flexible scheduling and condensed training modules.

Participant Logistics

Balancing participant travel, availability, and other work commitments required additional mentoring and coordination.

Triumphs

Multiplier Effect: Your £10,000 grant unlocked over £100,000 in co-funding, amplifying impact tenfold.

Despite challenges, all EIF-agreed milestones were delivered on time and to a high standard, while building sustainable infrastructure for future growth.
